A forum geared to the exchange of thoughts, views and experiences on children performing music. At the same time our competition does not aspire to 'set or break any records'. Our aim is to promote the love of music for its own sake, in a peaceful and relaxed atmosphere. The whole concept of the competition is geared to giving each and every young musician stage experience. It is also for this reason that we prefer applicants from small, out of the way, often provincial centres. Though we remain committed to seeking and promoting outstanding talent, we would like young artists to treat participation in the competition as a prize in itself. Something that motivates each and every one of them to greater effort and achievement, on the road to finding their own place in the world of music.*

#### 2. CONDITIONS

- 2.1 The competition is open to children and young people from Poland and abroad.

**The application form should include the following attachments:**

- ∇ **Participants photograph** (9 x 12 cm) or electronic (JPG, TIF);
  - ∇ **Proof of payment** of the appropriate registration fee:
    - a) for participants in the Solo Section and in the Duet or Chamber Ensemble Sections - €60 for each participant;
  - ∇ **Birth certificate** or any document confirming candidate's date of birth, (a photocopy or scan is acceptable).

- Fees are non-refundable where a candidate withdraws from the competition, however fees will be returned to candidates who do not qualify for entry.

- 2.5 The submission of an application is deemed to imply acceptance of the conditions as outlined in the regulations governing this competition.
- 2.6 Registration of participants takes place during the inaugural concert on, or on the day the candidate performs.
- 2.7 Participants are responsible for their own transport, board and accommodation (for further information please refer to our web site).

### **3. COMPETITION OUTLINE**

#### **3.1 Competition sections:**

- 1) Piano (solo);
- 2) Piano duet (for four hands);
- 3) Instrumental duet and Chamber Ensemble and String Quartet ;
- 4) Soloists (violin and cello)

#### **Competition Category:**

- A – born in 2010 and younger
- B - born in 2007 and younger
- C - born in 2004 and younger
- D – born in 2000 and younger
- E – born in 1992 and younger

#### **Competition Calendar:**

04- 05 December – eliminations: Soloists, Instrumental Duet, Chamber Ensemble and String Quartet.

06-08 December - Competition eliminations Piano solo and Piano Duet;

09 December – Prizewinners Concert in Royal Castle Warsaw

3.2 Competition eliminations are one stage and take place in the Concert Hall of the Łomianki Cultural Centre.

3.3 A meeting of jurors with teachers and students is envisaged.

3.4 Acoustic trials are envisaged in the Concert Hall on Inauguration day as well as during competition elimination days, before as well as after auditions (a register will apply).

Auditions will be held in alphabetical order.

3.5 The competition organisers reserve the right to change section audition days, conditional on the number of participants.

3.6 All competition elimination performances, including all auditions and the Prizewinners Concert are public performances, however all property rights to the said performances are deemed by all participants to belong to the competition organiser, and pass to the said organiser free of any charge. The organiser reserves the right to photograph, record, and distribute performances as well as make use of the works performed, without time, territorial or any other limits. Including rights to: (a) transcription, by any technique and without copy limits; (b) Trade; (c) Public performance, reproduction, and distribution in the form of compact discs, video and cassette recordings, or in any other way, or by any other means that the organiser might deem appropriate, without the need to remunerate any participant in any way <sup>1</sup>. Persons or organisations, as deemed appropriate by the competition organiser, may also exercise the above rights.

3.7 All competition performances are judged by a Jury. The Jury is composed of eminent musicians, artists and teachers. Jury decisions cannot go to appeal and are final.

3.8 All other matters, meritorious and organisational, falling outside the jury's remit, are subject to the Competition Director's decision, whose decision is final and not subject to appeal.

3.9 The Competition Jury is appointed by the Director of the Art Education Centre [*Centrum Edukacji Artystycznej*].

## 4. COMPETITION PRIZES

- 4.1 The first three winners in each instrumental section and category receive the title of laureate.
- 4.2 A special prize will be awarded to the best performer of a work by Polish composer Frederic Chopin and to the best performer of a work by Juliusz Zarębski.
- 4.3 The Jury reserve the right not to award prizes or to award them *ex aequo*.
- 4.4 All money and material prizes conferred by both institutions and private individuals, and awarded outside the competition's remit, must be reported to the Competition Secretariat.
- 4.5 Laureate diplomas and material prizes are only available for collection on the day of the Prizewinners Concert <sup>2</sup>.
- 4.6 Laureates and participants who receive an honourable mention are obliged to perform at the Prizewinners Concert.

## 5. PROGRAMME **Important:** (i) Participants can apply to compete in higher age categories; (ii) Performance sequence as outlined below:-

### 5.1 Piano solo

#### Category A (time: up to 10 min)

- 1) Baroque piece;
- 2) Free choice;
- 3) Piece by a Polish composer.

#### Category B (time: up to 12 min)

- 1) Baroque piece;
- 2) Piece by a Polish composer;
- 3) Free choice.

#### Category C (time: up to 15 min)

- 1) **One** of the following group works:
  - a) J.S.Bach – Three part inventions, or two contrasting Suite movens or a Prelude and Fugue from “Das Wohltemperierte Klavier”, or D. Scarlatti Sonata**or**
  - b) Variations, or Rondo an Allegro Sonata (works from the Classical period);
- 2) Etude or a virtuoso piece;
- 3) Piece by a Polish or other composer.

#### Category D (time: up to 20 min)

- 1) Baroque piece;
- 2) Virtuoso Etude – by F. Chopin, F. Liszt, S. Rachmaninov, A. Skriabin, J. Zarębski, G. Ligetti or Virtuoso piece;
- 3) Allegro Sonata (works from the Classical period);

#### Category E (time: up to 25 min)

**Recital** - free choice, but : with obligatory piece of Juliusz Zarębski.

### 5.2 Piano duet for four hands

#### Categories A-B

Free programme choice (transcriptions acceptable).  
Programme duration: up to 15 minutes.

#### Categories C- D - E

Original piece of Baroque or Classicism Period;  
Original piece of Romanticism Period or XX – XXI century.  
Programme duration: up to 20 minutes.

### **5.3 Instrumental Duet and Chamber Piano Ensemble or String Quartet**

- Category A and B**            1. Piece of Baroque or Classicism Period; up to 15 minutes duration  
   2. Free choice
- Category C**                    1. Piece by a Polish composer.  
   2. Free choice
- Category D and E**    Free choice of programme(original piece) - 20 minutes duration <sup>3</sup>.

### **5.4 Soloists (violon and cello)**

**Category A** (up to 10 minutes)  
Two or three contrasting pieces.

**Category B (time: up to 12 min)**  
Two or three contrasting pieces, free choice, but : with obligatory Piece by a Polish composer

**Category C (time: up to 15 min)**  
1) Two contrasting Pieces of Baroque or Classicism Period (Suite, Partita, Sonata).  
2) Virtuoso piece;  
3) Free choice;

**Category D (time: up to 20 min)**  
1) Virtuoso piece (solo);  
2) Piece or Two contrasting Pieces of Baroque or Classicism Period (Suite, Partita, Sonata).  
3) Piece by a Polish composer;

**Category E (time: up to 20 min)**  
Free choice, but : with obligatory Piece by a Polish composer
